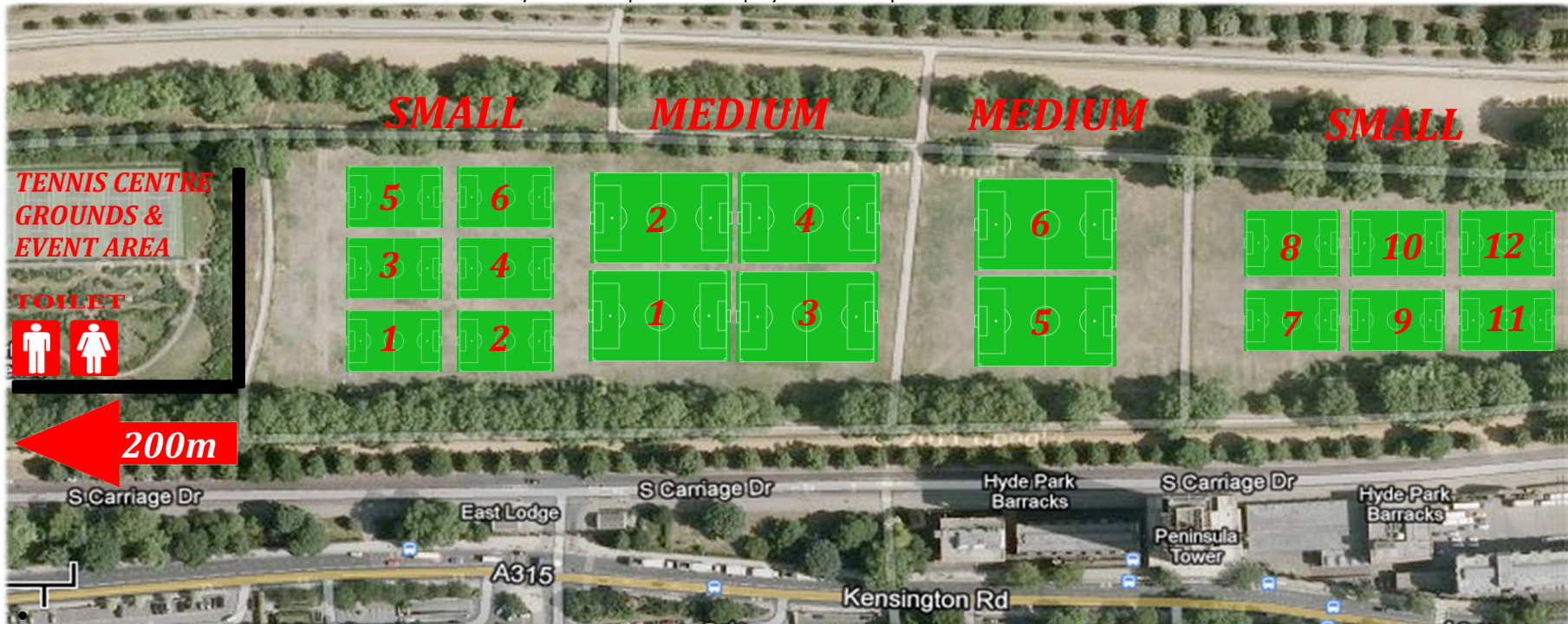


OLD FOOTBALL PITCHES (OFP) LAYOUT AND KEY GUIDELINES FOR PLAYERS
12 x SMALL (50x30 5-a-side) and 6 x MEDIUM (60x40 9- a- side)

History of the OFP - The OFP is a multi-use grass playing field. 'Pitches' are completely unmarked. Please note that pitches are not maintained to a 'Premium' sports field standard and only low level sports can be played on these pitches which are of reasonable condition.



- A designated player/organiser should contact reception on arrival for pitch allocation prior to entering the pitches. Booked activity always takes priority over walk-on casual play. In case of any disputes, please call Will to Win (WTW) (based at the Tennis Centre) on 020 7262 3474.
- Everyone associated with the centre and facilities should show respect and understanding for the safety and welfare of others. Users are encouraged to share concerns about any aspect of operations and facilities.
- Abuse towards centre staff, bullying, physical violence towards others will not be tolerated and can result in a player being banned from the pitches.
- No Company Branding of ANY sort is permitted on the Old Football Pitches.
- Players are responsible for removing all litter from the site.
- To the extent permitted by law, WTW Ltd will not accept responsibility for any injuries incurred during play at WTW in any weather/ground conditions.
- All players must report any injuries to WTW.
- Appropriate sporting attire should be worn on pitch and shirts must be worn at all times.
- The football area cannot be used for sports other than football, softball, rounders, tag rugby, volleyball or frisbee without prior agreement from the centre's management. Other sports to be approved on a case by case basis. Balls used for softball/rounders must be 'soft' balls and not hard. Ball games are not permitted to be played near footpaths.
- In line with the park bylaws, players must NOT: Setup any infrastructure including portaloos and gazebos unless agreed in advance with WTW • Fix items to trees railings, fences or other structures • Drive stakes into the ground • Cook or barbecue any food ONLY cold food is permitted, or light any fires • Leave items unattended in the parks • Let the event interfere with any other Park users or obstruct other park users • Do bucket collections or similar, i.e. solicit donations from park visitors • Balloon releases • Pyrotechnics • Amplified music • Glass • Disturb any wildlife • Vehicles on the OFPs themselves – they need to park on the P and D bays (max stay - 4 hours) and carry infrastructure across. Commercial Vehicles are NOT permitted in Hyde Park without prior consent of The Royal Parks
- Alcoholic drinks must be available free of charge (i.e. not for sale), and for consumption by your guests in accordance with the City of Westminster licensing requirements who are over the age of 18. Alcohol should only be consumed in moderation.
- Dogs are not permitted on football pitches with the exception of guide dogs. Riding of bicycles and scooters is strictly prohibited on the football pitches.
